

YOU WANNA GO TO GHANA? HERE'S WHY YOU'LL NEVER WANT TO LEAVE!

If you're itching for a trip that packs history, culture, and a dash of adventure into every moment, Ghana's got four cities that'll have you bragging for years. Start in Cape Coast, where the haunting Cape Coast Castle stands as a powerful reminder of the transatlantic slave trade—walk through the infamous Door of No Return, then step out to sweeping ocean views that'll have your camera working overtime. If you're feeling brave (or just want to show off on Instagram), head to Kakum National Park for the canopy walk—350 meters of wobbly bridges suspended above the rainforest. And if you've ever wanted to feed a crocodile (because who hasn't?), Hans Cottage Botel is your spot.



Hop over to Elmina, where Elmina Castle's whitewashed walls hold centuries of stories and Fort St. Jago offers panoramic views worth every uphill step. Don't miss a boat cruise on the lagoon, where local fishermen might just let you in on their secrets—spoiler: it's not just about the bait. If you're lucky, you'll stumble into a cooking workshop or a festival, where the only thing more colorful than the costumes is the laughter.

Next, make your way to Kumasi, the beating heart of Ashanti culture. The Manhyia Palace brings Ashanti royalty to life, and the Kejetia Market is a wild maze of kente cloth, gold trinkets, and enough street food to keep you snacking all day. Watch artisans weave kente or carve wood, and don't be shy—join a dance or two! Finally, land in Accra, where the energy never quits. Chill at Labadi Beach, wander through Makola Market, and climb to the top of Independence Arch for city views (and a killer selfie). If you're not swept up in a street party by sundown, you're doing it wrong. Ghana's calling—don't let this epic adventure be the one you only hear about from someone else.
